They tried all of the schools in the area, but they didn't seem safe enough for me to attend, so after a few days, my dad talked to Miss Gwen about me coming to Mt Clare. Being at Mt. Clare is the best experience I ever had at school.

On September 21, 2017, one month after my mom passed away and on my grandfather's birthday, I was having a conversation with Miss Angie, because I was very sad talking about my mom and grandfather. Miss Angie began to comfort me and share with me how death isn't the end for those who believe in Christ and who ask him to be their Lord and Savior. I told Miss Angie I wanted to give my heart to God. Miss Angie prayed with me and led me to Christ. I am learning so much about God in my paces, morning meeting and in chapel. I am developing a relationship with God, and before coming to MCCS, I didn't think that was possible. I am so grateful for my teachers, Miss Amy and Miss Angie, and my principal, Miss Gwen. They helped me have a relationship with God and have loved and supported me through all my difficult times.

My name is Isaiah and I am 14 years old. I am not originally from Baltimore. I was born in Martinsburg, West Virginia and I lived there until I was about 5 years old. In my personal opinion, I think my hometown is way better than Baltimore. There is less drug use and violence and it's also a lot safer. The reason I'm here and not there is because we lost our house and had nowhere else to go other than Baltimore.

I have been through many things in my life. However, in seventh grade, Elaine Delp, a lady from the church, helped me get into MCCS. Mount Clare has helped me out with a lot of my problems with my faith and I think if I hadn't started attending the school and youth group, I don't think I would be a Christian. The school has really helped me get close to God and know him more. I feel like our school has really saved my life. I plan on finishing high school at Mount Clare and I feel confident that I will be prepared for college - thanks to the school.

Mount Clare Christian School currently has three openings for teaching staff. We are looking for an Elementary Assistant Teacher, a Supervising Teacher in High School and an Assistant Teacher at the High School level. Our mission is to provide a quality Christ-centered education for children in our neighborhood. MCCS is an evangelistic outreach of Wilkens Avenue Mennonite Church.

We are looking for teachers who are at least 21 years of age, who are devoted to Christ, active members of a church, have experience working with children and youth and a strong academic background. Our teachers serve as role-models to students in life and faith; character and integrity are of the utmost importance.

MCCS utilizes the Accelerated Christian Education (ACE) mastery system of learning. Teachers work as educational guides in the classroom, assisting students with meeting daily work goals.

The Supervising Teacher and Assistant Teacher are paid positions, however, the salaries are low as our teachers are also missionaries to the students and parents of our Baltimore neighborhood. Our tuition is only \$25 per month for each student.
